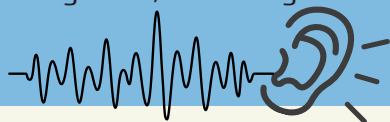


In Maths, we have been learning how to partition, order and compare decimals. We went out on the playground and added decimals together using chalk. We have also been working very hard practising our timestables.
